Torrance Swats Way to Victory

Taney Team Clouts 16 Hits
to Trim Houghton Park
Sunday

After their slashing contest of
Easter Sunday, when the El Paso
shoemen wrecked Torrance hopes
in a ninth inning rally, the Taney-
men had a rather easy picking
against the Houghton team, at
Houghton Park, North Long
Beach, last Sunday.

Torrance laid down a barrage of
sixteen hits, among them being
two homers, a three-bagger and a
couple of two-base blows.
File was in fine form and held
the Houghtonites scoreless after
the third inning. The third frame
held about the only prospect of dis-
aster for File, when Morrow
struck, E. Daley secured free trans-
portation to first, and Lower fol-
lowed with a single that scored
Morrow. File tightened up then
and set down the next three on
strikes.

Torrance started with a rush in
the first and rolled up four tal-
lies. The boys were all hitting well
and made most of their blows
count.
Atwood had a field day at bat.
In five trips to the plate he se-
cured a walk, three safe hits, one
of them a two-bagger, and a
scratch hit which the second base-
man juggled, allowing Atwood to
reach first on an error.
File also fattened his batting
average. In five times at bat he
registered a three-bagger and two
singles, a sacrifice hit, and met the
ball once only to be thrown out at
first.

will play Monrovia at that city.


