BLUES BREAK EL PASO RUN OF VICTORIES

Fifteen Hits off Rodriguez Give Torrance 6 to 3 Edge Over Shoemen

Several hundred fans at Wrigley Field Los Angeles saw the Torrance Blues break the winning streak of the El Paso Shoemen's last aggregation, when they took the Shoemen on Sunday last by a score of 6 to 3.

According to the uptown sports writers the Shoemen had credit for fourteen straight victories, and if this is the correct dope the Spanish boys have won both games in every double-header played since October 6 when the Torrance boys

spilled them 7 to 1 in the last half of a public ball played at White Sox park.

Last Sunday's game was a tight pitcher's battle, with Ault having a bit of the edge. Rodriguez was touched for fifteen safe blows, passed two men and hit two, but Umpire Beck laughingly declined to let Pearl reap the benefit of a smack in the ribs. Pearl promptly retaliated with a loud blow for three sacks, and scored on Ducauzau's single with the winning run.

Both teams threatened in the first inning, but were unable to put over any runs. Orozco first man up hit one for two bases, went to third on Soto's sacrifice, and was touched out at home when he attempted to score on Lima's grounder to Ducauzau. Johnny made a fast throw to Goodman, who half-speaker doubled and Lopez drew the only pass issued by Ault. Gamboa popped out to Goodman and Perez singled, scoring Speaker. Rodriguez hit safely, scoring Lopez. Orozco hit to short and Wolfe tossed to Ducauzau forcing Rodriguez, but Johnny threw low to Atwood and Orozco was safe, while Perez romped home. For the next five innings neither team could put over a run. Torrance spilled its chances in the fifth when two men were on a first one out. Your was forced out at third on Pearl's hit to the third baseman, and Goodman was touched out when he tried to sprint from first to third on the play.

Torrance broke the tie with Pearl's play in the eighth and came back in the ninth to put over two more runs, making the final count 6 to 3.

Wolfe fattened his batting average with four nice singles in five trips to the plate two of which accounted for runs. Ducauzau was second with three blows, one of them a two-bagger.
