Gloria Gorgeously Gowned in First Singing Picture Showing Here Next Week

In a dramatically forceful story and in a role that once again enables her to wear the beautiful clothes for which she has become famous on the screen, Gloria Swanson makes her debut in talking and singing films at the Torrance theatre next Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, Jan. 14-16, when "The Trespasser," her first all-dialogue United Artists picture, written and directed by Edmund Goulding opens.

While the star's gorgeous wardrobe recalls the days of her first cinema triumph, it is a new Gloria Swanson that the talking screen reveals in the United Artists picture. The rich tonal qualities of Miss Swanson's voice give fitting oral expression to her abilities as a dramatic actress.

With a story that is singularly

compelling, "The Trespasser" is said to usher in a new era in the audible cinema. Edmund Goulding, author and director of the United Artists picture, is said to have evolved a new art in the vehicle, so that the method of telling the story is as novel as the theme itself. Goulding also wrote the original number, "Love," which is one of the two pieces Miss Swanson sings in the feature.

A capable cast, all of whom are at home in speaking before the microphone, surrounds Miss Swanson in "The Trespasser." Robert Ames, accomplished actor of stage and screen, is the leading man. Others in support number Purnell Pratt, Henry B. Walthall, Wally Albright, William Holden, Blanche Frederick, Kay Hammond, Mary Forbes, and Marcela Corday.

Gleasons Great on Screen in "The Shannons of Broadway"

James and Lucile Webster Gleason, the highest-priced comedy team in the world, achieve their greatest success—surmounting anything they have ever done on the stage—in Universal's all-talking production of Gleason's comedy hit, "The Shannons of Broadway," playing Friday and Saturday at the Fox Redondo theatre.

This achievement is reached largely through the fact that the screen production of "The Shannons" contains features the stage production lacked and is far wider in scope, particularly in the range of its fast-moving action.

Wednesday and Thursday next week, the Fox Redondo will show Norma Shearer in an all talking romantic drama, "Their Own Desire," with a group of favorite stars. Harry Langdon will also be heard in his comedy success, "Skirt Shy."

MISSION PLAY SETS RECORD FEBRUARY 17
