Progress of MacMarr Stores for First Year Exceeds Expectations

The results of the first year's operations of the MacMarr Stores, Inc. and subsidiaries, exceeded even the forecast made at the time of forming the organization, according to figures revealed in the annual report just published. When compared with many business institutions an unusual increase ratio is reflected.

Sales for 1929 were estimated at approximately \$75,000,000 for the entire organization. The annual report shows them to have been more than \$87,000,000, this \$12,000,000 increase indicates the favorable response which food buyers gave the new company.

The net earnings of the organization, over the predecessor concern, now a part of it, show a decrease over the past three years of operations. The combined figures of the organization in 1926 showed net earnings of \$1,055,980 which had increased to \$2,178,523 at the close of 1929. This increase is largely the result of centralized control of operations which eliminates much expense and lowers the cost of goods to the customer so that automatically sales were increased.

The area covered by these stores represents the most diversified industries of any territory of like size in the country. The states included in their operations are Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, California, Arizona, New Mexico, Wyoming, Nebraska, and Colorado. In this territory are located MacMarr's 18 major divisions comprising 1400 retail food stores, 400 meat markets and 21 warehouses and plants employing between 5,000 and 7,000 persons with an annual payroll of from \$8,000,000 to \$9,000,000. More than \$1,750,000 per year is paid out in state and county taxes amounting to over \$400,000.

During 1929, twenty-five western food distributors joined the MacMarr organization and the work of standardization of merchandise, consolidating of warehouses, re-routing of transportation and coordinating of policies with those adopted by the new company, was accomplished. This task included, also, the necessary changes in equipment, signs, colors of stores and awnings so that these food centers would be uniform in all divisions.

The policy of the company favors and promotes the sale and use of western products. The company purchases more than \$12,000,000 of fruits and vegetables annually. It sends specialists into various producing centers, which are especially fitted for growing certain types of crops, to work with the farmer and growers to scientifically develop the resources of the community to the end of producing finer products which will rebound to the financial benefit of the community.

These stores are of definite material assistance to producers and growers in that they buy these products in carload lots, often entire crops, which tends toward stabilization of markets for these products. Their retail units furnish a ready and immediate distributing outlet, especially needed in case of perishable products, eliminating much waste through delay. The growing of better quality produce is encouraged by paying a premium on the market price for superior grades.

Two distinct types of stores are operated by MacMarr Stores. The self service type includes the MacMarr owned and operated "Piggly Wiggly" units in the following cities and vicinities: Seattle, Tacoma and Spokane; Fresno, Stockton and Modesto, California; Denver and Colorado Springs, Colorado; and Phoenix and Tucson, Arizona. MacMarr Stores also offer other types of self service. The service stores where salespeople wait on customers are found in every state in which the organization operates.

During the past year much improvement has been shown in the stores. They have been repainted, remodeled and renovated until they are bright and attractive. Each store is arranged in the latest manner of scientific efficiency and the ideal of the organization is to offer the housewife a complete food center where she may make her own selection of groceries, meats, fruits and vegetables under one roof, doing away with the necessity of shopping from store to store.

Better Understanding of Racial Ideals Sought in Youths' Tour of Orient

Opening of 1930 Roster Announced

In keeping with the trend toward increased interest in Far Eastern trade and toward international goodwill and amity, the third "Hands Across the Pacific" Tour to the Orient for young men will sail from San Francisco June 28th, returning September 6th—a seventy day trip to study China and Japan and the possibilities of better friendship between our Pacific coast and the peoples of the Orient. The tour will be under the direction of Carroll M. Powers, Professor of Economics at Modesto Junior College.


The group will be limited to twenty young men selected from among students in the colleges and universities of California and high school graduates of this Spring, for their character and fitness to represent the United States as unofficial ambassadors of goodwill to our Pacific neighbors. Since the tour is planned primarily on the basis of creating friendship, there is an opportunity for all civic bodies throughout the West to bring to the attention of those in charge the name of deserving young men who can be depended upon to carry forward this high purpose. In order to open the opportunity to many deserving students who cannot afford an expensive investment in education, the cost of this non-profit enterprise has been reduced to five hundred and fifty dollars, which includes all expenses of travel from either Los Angeles or San Francisco and return, including passports, library fees, tuition and even text books. The group will spend eighteen days in China, returning by way of Korea and spending three weeks in Japan.

In each country, the students will have the opportunity to meet outstanding leaders in politics, education and commerce, and also the opportunity to visit factories, commercial organizations and educational institutions in addition to Pacific.

The purpose of the tour is in keeping with the modern emphasis in business thinking to prepare the young men of today for the business responsibilities of tomorrow, and to create through them an era

of mutual better understanding of racial ideals and objectives which will make for greater cooperation of the peoples bordering on the Pacific.

The points of interest visited by all tourists. The American students will find Chinese, Korean and Japanese students in each city who will aid as hosts to the four and among whom friendships of lasting value will inevitably be formed. The "Hands Across the Pacific" Tours have been conducted for two successive years at the invitation of the Young Men's Christian Associations of Japan, China and Korea, with the cooperation of California business men interested in amicable relations with the Orient, and of Modesto Junior College. Their success as a medium for creating goodwill among the young men of the countries affected has won the recognition of leaders on both sides of the Pacific. Professor Killam of the University of Hawaii, one of the founders of the Institute of Pacific Relations, reports that the "Hands Across the Pacific" Tours were praised at the Kyoto conference as the outstanding contribution by students toward better Pacific understanding.

Would Make One School Do Work of Two, and Reduce Tax Burden

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Mar. 27.—(UP)—Instead of building new grammar schools in California when facilities become overcrowded, use the same school for a double shift of students each day.

An entirely new idea in solving the problem of increasing attendance in schools has been proposed by State Controller Ray L. Riley. It contemplates shortening the school day for students and increasing it for teachers. "No private business could exist by using its expensive equipment as short a time each year as we use our school houses," Riley said. "Los Angeles county has a capital outlay in its grammar schools of \$100,795,588, representing land, improvements, building and equipment. This investment is used for approximately 200 days each year, seven hours a day. "Then when we have more pupils come into a district, instead of doubling up and using the same investment for instructing them, we invest another large sum in capital outlay for their use. Imagine a business concern trying to get along by working their plant seven hours a day, 200 days in the year and then building a new plant when business increases. "It is absurd. The directors would find themselves bankrupt if they did not utilize their original facilities for longer hours, in place of building an entirely new factory for increased production. Riley contends that his plan is not only feasible but a fact toward which California must progress. "The taxpayers complain at the huge sum they must pay each year for schools. We are searching frantically for new sources of revenue. It would be better for us to turn our energies to devising means of making the present revenue do more work. "The objection has been raised that the hours would be too long for teachers and too short for proper instruction of pupils. "By starting school at 9 in the morning and continuing until 5 in the afternoon, two shifts of pupils could receive four hours instruction a day. By a very slight lengthening of the school year and a more intensive training, the same amount of work could be covered. "The teachers' salaries could be increased and their hours arranged so they would not have to teach continuously. That item of expense would be slight compared to the cost of building new schools."
