
"Whereas, it is a fact that when the water supply disappears growth will stop and, in fact, recede, and

**Local Jury Woman Tells of Big Trial**

live on the Clark jury said. "She was elected forewoman of the 12 as soon as I stepped through the door into the jury room after the case was given to us. I had no idea I was to be placed in that position."

Mrs. Thomas retains vivid impressions of the trial. "I had nothing whatever to say concerning the stand made by William E. Weller, jurymen from West Los Angeles, the lone hold-out salesman who prevented a decision. Ten ballots were taken, the last one requiring a 43-hour deliberation, but Mrs. Thomas did not recall any of the proceedings during the trial, and she was engaged in this work.

"While we were fully aware of our great task and the responsibilities of it, we were the lightest-hearted jury ever to have such an important case in Los Angeles. I have been told, Mrs. Thomas continued, "during most of the trial, we had a real good time. We were given wonderful treatment, and after I had told the bailiff that unless I had a chance to get some exercise I would fall then in the crucial moment, we did not have a substitute jurymen after the case had been given to us. We had plenty of exercise. This we took on the roof of our hotel, and on our picnic and bus trips."

Mrs. Thomas has received a number of letters since her return to Torrance commending her on her stand in the case. In addition to these communications, a number of Torrance residents have telephoned her their congratulations.

"Right after I got home the telephone began ringing and I have been assured that what we did was right. I think that was very fine of our people, because I am sure I tried to do my duty. "I wouldn't like to go through it again," she continued, "and I think that any re-trial of the case would result in the same manner as this trial. The entire case, I believe, is in the records and our decision, coming from a jury that came from widely separated spots in the county, is representative of the feeling of the people."

Believed Clark's Story  
In commenting on Clark and the struggle for a verdict of not guilty which began last Thursday afternoon, Mrs. Thomas was reported by Los Angeles newspapers as saying: "We, the eleven voting for acquittal, believed every bit of Clark's story of self-defense. We consider him a fine, clean, upstanding young man who told a straightforward story from the witness stand. We think that he was justified in protecting his life against those men, Crawford and Spencer whom Clark killed last May."

Mrs. Thomas is a firm believer in the American jury system. She has served on juries before, but never in a murder case until this time. Both Mr. and Mrs. Thomas are well known in Torrance, being active in social and church circles. Mrs. Thomas is the daughter of Charles Quandt, one of the city's pioneer residents.

**Local Jury Woman Tells of Big Trial**

All tires that have run over 10,000 miles should be dismantled from the wheels for a thorough internal inspection in order to guard against possible failure from injuries not visible on the surface, declares Douglas Collins, the local Firestone dealer. The air containing assembly, which is the only cord body of the tire, and including the flap, rim, tube and the valve and its parts, must be in efficient order if deflation is to be avoided. It is the experience of all tire dealers that more than one-half of all the tires they take in trade have internal injuries that must be repaired before being reused, or that they are injured beyond repair and must be scrapped.

"A vast percentage of the failures are caused from something which happens from three weeks to three months previous to the actual deflation of the tire on the road. Rotted spots due to water seepage in mail holes, carcass breaks, bad beads, imbedded glass, tread cuts, bent rims, and many other conditions bring about tire failure."
