## 'Man Who Came Back' Lectures Sunday Evening

Fifty-six times arrested and faced trials, but only twice convicted during the 26 years in the underworld, its master mind and most notorious crook, W. H. (Bill) Cook, gambler, gunman and gangster, "came back" May, 1914, at Memphis, Tennessee.  
Cook was wounded 17 times during the World War—gassed twice very badly and was awarded four war medals and rank of lieutenant when he returned to Canada. Cook may be heard in a special lecture at the Torrance Christian church next Sunday evening, September 6, at 7:30 o'clock.

## Noted Philosopher Speaks at Church Sunday Afternoon

Dr. A. U. Michelson, Judge and criminal lawyer from Berlin, Germany, and cousin of the late Dr. Albert Michelson, Pasadena scientist, will speak in the First Baptist church, Carson and Martina streets, in a mass meeting of all churches, Sunday, September 6, at 2:45 p. m.

Dr. Michelson is the son of an orthodox Jew and was brought up in the house of a Jewish rabbi. He studied in the University of Berlin and other European universities, and graduated with the highest degree. Through the study of philosophy, he became a freethinker and repudiated all religion, Judaism included. He was convinced that philosophy was the greatest thing in the world, and he expressed the thought before the International Diplomatic club that the world could only succeed by philosophy.  
After his conversion to Christianity he gave up his large practice and was called as a professor of foreign languages and literature to America, where he has spoken in universities, colleges and theological seminaries. From an atheist, he has become one of the most devoted followers of Christ. It is an exceptional opportunity that comes to Torrance and vicinity to hear this Jew tell about his people and the fulfillment of prophecy.


