They Say Torrance Should

Vote Water Bonds Tuesday

of the Knights of Columbus, emphasizes: "The opportunity for Torrance to show its faith in the vote recently cast so overwhelmingly to join the Metropolitan District will be presented Tuesday. I am sure every thinking citizen will vote in favor of these bonds and thus insure our local industries and the future of this community."

Herbert S. Wood, principal of the High School and president of the Rotary Club, declares: "What appeals to me about the Metropolitan Water District is the fact that we get so much for so little. True, the bond issue is large, but its cost to the taxpayers to only 10 cents per \$100 assessed valuation over the 15-year period when no part of the principal is to be paid. Then there is an opportunity to put our unemployed district residents and citizens to work. I cannot see any reason why the bonds should not receive every voter's endorsement."

J. W. Leach, manager of the Torrance Branch, Bank of America, points out: "Water is the life blood of Southern California. Now comes a chance to protect that life fluid by tapping the Colorado River. Industries of Southern California need a steady, ample flow of water and I believe in the Metropolitan plan for the Colorado aqueduct. This \$220,000,000 bond issue is not a Los Angeles plan, or a Pasadena or Long Beach plan—but it is the joint obligation assumed by all the present and future members of the District. We can take no better step to growth, safety and future prosperity than by adequately safeguarding interests of the present while making logical provisions for the future."

Harum E. Reave, one of Torrance's oldest—in point of residence—citizens, recalls: "In 1907 while a resident of Los Angeles I was active in helping to put over the Owens River aqueduct project. The need today is greater than it was in the early days and the only insurance of this great Metropolitan District is to vote the bond issue next Tuesday."

Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Meinzer and family will move next week from their home in the Palms Verdennes Estates to the P. G. Briney residence on Post avenue, Torrance. The Brineys are moving to San Pedro, where Mr. Briney's law office is located.

DeKalb Spurlin, president of the Chamber of Commerce, declares: "The preponderance of support and advocacy of the Metropolitan Water bonds throughout the District should remove any doubt from the minds of voters concerning the importance of the issue. Torrance and the other 12 member-cities of the project are underwriting their insurance policies for future growth and greatness next Tuesday. The failure of this issue would be a calamity and is unthinkable. I am confident Torrance will render an overwhelming favorable vote and gain everything by so doing. Our proportion of labor benefits and the good that will come to our industries should prompt every citizen who desires to restore prosperity to vote for the bonds."

Sam Rappaport, president of the Kiwanis Club, states: "The slogan of Kiwanis is, 'We Build.' Members of the local club will have an opportunity to demonstrate that they believe in their slogan next Tuesday when the Metropolitan bonds will be submitted to the voters. No greater constructive project for the insurance of empire building in Southern California has ever been presented to the citizens and Torrance will find her place in the sun with the success of this great utility. Every voter in Torrance should be in favor of this enterprise."

Frank Spoon, a well-known citizen, who has always been interested in civic advancement, says: "With the attitude of the Pacific Electric and every other major industrial institution thoroughly pronounced in favor of the Metropolitan bonds, I cannot imagine any working man or woman not being for this project. Southern California industry and its future is dependent on an adequate

supply of water. Labor is dependent on industry and will supply help itself by supporting this important project. There should not be a vote against it."
