Seek Lower Fire Insurance Rates
A new survey of fire insurance rates will be made in Torrance within six or eight weeks. Chamber of Commerce officials learned this week in response to a communication addressed to the Board of Underwriters of the Pacific some time ago by chamber officials requesting a lowering of fire insurance rates.
The last survey was made in November, 1927, at which time the rates which were established in 1924 were renewed. Chamber officials state that fire risks in Torrance are considerably less than in 1924 and the city's fire-fighting equipment has been improved. Los Angeles recently won a 20 per cent reduction in basic fire insurance rates and officials are hopeful that the coming survey by the fire underwriters will mean a reduction in the basic rates here.

IMPROVE CROSSING
