The winner of the honor will be given \$300 toward expenses of her trip to Chicago and return. She also will be given credentials by Gov. James Rolph, Jr., as the official "Miss California."

All contestants selected will gather at the state fair in Sacramento on Admission Day, September 9th, for the final judging. The contest is open to all girls and women residing in California. There is no age limit. The basis of judging will be: personality, general knowledge of California, and attractiveness. It is the aim of the state fair board and the world's fair commissioners to select an "Miss California" one who is intelligent as well as attractive, and qualified to answer questions pertaining to California's resources, production and points of interest.
