Sermon Dedicated to Washington Is Valued Heirloom

ALLEN TOWN, Pa.—(U.P.)—The rites of the Ahimam Reason of Masonry and a sermon dedicated to George Washington are printed in a volume of Masonic ritual published in 1782 and now a valued heirloom held by Mrs. Ethel Reichard, here.

The book, its pages discolored and dried by the years, was the property of Robert Carr Wilson, the owner's grandfather, and was presented him when he became a member of Masonic Lodge No. 2, Philadelphia, second oldest in the United States.

Washington was a member of the Alexandria, Va., Lodge, No. 1, the oldest.

The sermon, printed after the ritual, was delivered by the Rev. Smith in Christ church, Philadelphia, on December 20, 1779, in the presence of Washington.

A scroll on the flyleaf bears the name of "Benj. Meredith," but there is no explanation of its significance.
