Disappearance of Redondo School Man May Be Hoax

Late reports regarding the disappearance of E. B. Thomas, missing superintendent of Redondo Beach schools, seem to indicate that the man has not been murdered by safe-crackers as was first supposed, but that he has voluntarily "dropped out of sight. Police of Redondo Beach are inclined to the theory that the signs of a struggle in Thomas's office at the Central grammar school were arranged by himself, and that he had fled in a small car which he is said to have purchased several weeks ago, leaving one car with lights on and motor running in front of the school. His description is being broadcast over the state in an effort to apprehend him, should this theory be correct. Persistent search of Palos Verdes hills and the surrounding territory have produced no trace of him.
