**Mexican People Living In Torrance Prefer To Remain**

Torrance has yet to send its first repatriate back to Mexico, it was learned today from records of the county charities department. While 9313 persons have taken advantage of the county's offer to return them to their native land free of charge, not one of them has come from Torrance, the records showed.

Average cost of repatriating the Mexicans has been \$15.63, while it costs the county \$34 a month to care for the average Mexican welfare case, which is figured at 4.25 persons. Computing on this basis, the repatriation of the 9313 persons has saved the taxpayers of the county \$768,789 net to date, it is computed by Rex Thompson, deputy superintendent of charities.

The eleventh special train is to leave Los Angeles on December 8 over the Southern Pacific, with approximately 1100 persons on board. The Mexican government looks after the welfare of the repatriates upon their return to their native land.
