Public is invited to hear Speaker At High School Monday Evening

Technocracy, the new theory of economics which has set America to thinking, will be the topic of a lecture in Torrance Monday night, March 13.

George R. Kirkpatrick, author of "War... What For?" and "Think or Surrender" and other writings, will speak at 8:00 o'clock at the Torrance high school auditorium.

Admission will be free, and the general public is invited. Kirkpatrick will explain the proposition sponsored by Howard Scott and his group of scientists who have been conducting an industrial survey of the United States covering a period of the past 12 years. The lecture is sponsored by a Torrance committee, which includes S. W. Smith, J. M. Smith, H. Raymond and S. D. Boice.

They invite all thinking people to attend.

Topics to be touched upon in Kirkpatrick's address will be the "price system," the gold standard and the credit system. The plan of the technocrats and how it can be inaugurated.

Narbonne took first in the mixed relay, handing up a new record of 2:15.3, and second in the class C medley where North Hollywood set a new record of 3:41.4.

Eleven new records were hung up in this meet which attracted teams from practically every high school in the county.
