There are many types of raisin pies, those made with just raisins, raisins combined with cranberries, prunes, raspberries, or included in any cream pie. Men are very fond of real raisin pie with a real raisin flavor and this is the variety of pie which is made by following the recipe given here.

Real Raisin Pie
1 1/2 cups seeded raisins
1 1/4 cups water
1/4 cup sugar
1 tsp. corn starch
1 tsp. lemon juice
1 tsp. grated lemon rind
1 tsp. butter.

Add the raisins to the water and bring to the boiling point. Combine the sugar with the corn starch, moisten with a little cold water and add to the raisins. Stir constantly until the mixture boils and is clear. Add the lemon rind, lemon juice, and butter. Mix well. Cool slightly. Pour into a pastry lined pie pan, cover with a top crust or strips of pastry. Bake in a hot oven (450° F.) about 30 minutes.
