Prizes Are Awarded In School Courtesy Contest

First prize in the recent Courtesy Contest, conducted by the students of the Torrance high school, which began in February, was awarded to Lee Burns, age 18, whose contribution in writing was selected as the best in the boys' division.

First prize for the best contribution in writing in the girls' division went to Eva Hamman, and a prize for the best contribution by either boy or girl after the winners in the divisions had been selected, went to Ruth Granger.

Lee's prize was a billfold, donated by J. C. Penney Company; Eva Hamman received a dress, given by Sam Levy's, and Ruth Granger a pen and pencil set given by the Aileen Drug Co.

Other winners in the contest, for which no prizes were awarded however, were Victor Rose and Elizabeth Bulpitt, whose drawings were selected as the best in the two divisions, and will appear in the high school annual.

The contest was sponsored as a means of arousing interest in the "trade at home" movement, and principally to bring about among the Torrance students a recognition of the service that the local merchants render to the community.

Each student who entered a drawing, a slogan or a brief theme on the advantages of trading at home in the contest was required to secure the signatures of at least four Torrance merchants on their contribution as proof that he or she had contacted the local business houses.

More than 200 pupils entered the contest, some of them contributing three or four articles, or drawings, so that a wealth of material confronted the judges when they selected the prize winners. All the contributions were excellent, witty, wise and very much to the point.
