SHOE PRICES TO ADVANCE, WARNS KARL

Warning of impending advances in retail shoe prices was received this week by Bernard Mattson, manager of Karl's Shoe Store in Torrance, in a letter from P. Karl, president of the company. Mr. Karl's letter follows:

"You are, no doubt, familiar with the tremendous advances that have taken place during the past 60 days in the primary commodity markets, particularly affecting leather and other materials used in the manufacture of shoes. These recent developments have created a situation that we have not ever experienced. Not only have all material prices advanced from 30% to 60% with an increase of raw hides of over 200%, but the markets are firm and prices are still going up. In addition, it has been reported the last few days that labor has been generally increased from 5% to 10%."

"It naturally follows that a revision of retail selling prices will be absolutely necessary if previous quality is to be maintained. I propose to maintain quality as heretofore. We would urge you to pass on this information to all your customers to take advantage of our present prices, as it will be impossible to continue to sell merchandise at today's prices for any length of time. We, of course, have covered for a great amount of merchandise, but with our turnover of over 100,000 pairs of shoes a month that we are selling in our 75 stores, it will not be long before our present stocks will be consumed. This information is authentic to the best of our knowledge, as it comes direct from the largest manufacturers in the industry."
