

Walt Disney's "Three Little Pigs" and a big bad wolf, which will be seen and heard at the Torrance Theatre tonight, Friday and Saturday, has brought a neat fortune to its author. Already sales of the picture total \$1,000,000 and another half million is expected to be realized.

And, strangely enough, Disney was forced to "sell" the idea of the tremendously popular cartoon to his staff, which remained cold during two conference sessions. Third time proved the charm, however, and "Three Little Pigs" started to grow. Its unusual hit possibilities weren't foreseen; it was to be a typical (which means good) Disney Silly Symphony, but now look at it—most people have done so several times.

began on it and just about that time Pinto Colvig, former newspaper man who had been working for Disney, suggested a line which was to become a theatrical, radio and sheet-music sensation. It ran like this: "Who's afraid of the Big, Bad Wolf," just that and nothing more. Frank Churchill, now the toast of popular music circles, wrote the jingly tune in five minutes, while one Sears collaborated with Colvig on the lyrics.

Originally the words appeared like this: "Who's afraid of the big, bad wolf; the big, bad wolf; the big, bad wolf. Who's afraid of the big, bad wolf; he don't know from nothin'..." That last line didn't fit somehow, and the boys toiled for some time, attempting to find a word to rhyme with wolf. Finally, one said in despair, "Let's just let the flute take it," and so the famous "tra, la, la, la" slipped in to finish the first hit tune to come from a cartoon studio.

This year's plans of Disney call for 13 Mickey Mouse cartoons and 13 Symphonies, including "Old King Cole," "The Grasshopper and the Ant," and "Mickey and the Beanstalk," in which Mickey plays the part of Jack.
