
A. Buchanan, 1222 Arlington, reported to police Friday morning that \$42 in currency had been taken from the pocket of a pair of trousers some time Tuesday.

Two New Camps Authorized For Winter Season

C. C. Will Be Located In Mint and Tuna Canyons

Two additional camps for the Civilian Conservation Corps have been authorized for the winter season in the forest area of Los Angeles county.

The camps will be in Tuna Canyon, in the western end of La Crescenta valley, and in Mint Canyon. Buildings for the Tuna Canyon camp are being constructed by the Earl Canyon Camp.

The Mint Canyon camp buildings, which will be located at the Hauser ranch, are being constructed by a detachment of men from the Malibu camp in the western end of the county.

The chief project at Mint Canyon camp will be the construction of a motor way over the summit of the Sierra Pelona range with a lateral roadway connecting it with the forest service motor way constructed two years ago, Turner stated.

Turner pointed with pride to the fact that 25 pickup cars and trucks assigned to the four C. C. Camps under his supervision had traveled 66,619 miles between June 17 and October 1 with but one collision resulting in a dented fender, no one was injured.

"Credit must be given to the camp superintendents and mechanics for the manner in which the transportation problem has been handled," Turner added.

"Rules and regulations covering care and operation have been most rigid. Selection of drivers by driving tests for these narrow mountain roadways and newly constructed truck trails is showing results," the warden concluded.

The four C. C. Camps are designated as Salt Creek, Cobal, Earl and Malibu.

Former U. S. Steel Head to Give Talk At Chamber Meet

SAN FRANCISCO.—The tenth western divisional meeting of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, under the chairmanship of Paul Shoup, Southern Pacific head, will be held in Sacramento, California, December 5.

"Steps Ahead in National Recovery" is to be the subject of an address by Henry I. Harriman, national chamber president. Fred W. Sargent, president of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway Company, will forward his views on "Taxation and Current Expenditures," James A. Farrell, formerly president of the United States Steel Corporation, will outline why "We Need Foreign Trade, Too."

Problems of a controversial character are not to be left untouched, but are planned to receive careful analysis as evidenced by "Public Works and Public Ownership" to be presented by Frederick J. Koster, president of the California Barrel Company.

"Trade Relations With Russia" by Jerome Landfield of San Francisco, "Future Mining Policy" by William V. Hodges of Denver, "The Industrial Codes" by A. Schlicher, president Samson Tire and Rubber Company, Los Angeles, are to be given major consideration.

The retailers' code, the lumber code and the petroleum code are to be given equally prominent positions by leaders in these respective fields, as are "The Agricultural Adjustment Act" and "Our Relations with the Orient."

This meeting, serving as a medium for chambers of commerce and trade associations in focusing western opinion on national business legislation, is planned to be one of the most representative and largest gatherings of its kind yet held in the West.
