FRESNO, Calif. (U.P.)—There'll be a hot time in the old town—two years from now, Mayor Z. S. Leyland claims.


BEND MAN GROWS POTATOES IN AIR


Roller Skates Cause Broken Arm

Hints For The Amateur Gardener

Through an arrangement with Harry Nelson, Los Angeles gardening expert, the Herald will offer each week a timely article on the proper planting and cultivation of seasonal flowers.

There are probably a great many late gardeners wondering if they can still plant seed and hope to get bloom from them. It is quite possible to plant seed yet and a few will bloom before the winter has passed. Only a very few, however, and it is better to count on the bloom next spring.

Some of the harder-to-grow seeds may be planted now, such as primrose, stocks, snapdragons, schizanthus and nemosins. These names may be a bit hard to overcome at first, but the gardener who takes a chance and tries them is sure of a treat.

A good way to fix soil to plant seed in flats is as follows. If you have some well rotted barnyard manure or some leafmold, put about a quarter or a third with your soil and mix thoroughly.

These things under the names by which they may be found. If in doubt, write and ask for more details, or look around at the neighbor's place and you might find it.

Lot Buyers Are Warned Against Illegal Offers

Sub-divisions Not Recorded By Maps Cause Grief to Purchasers.

Los Angeles county's back-to-the-farm movement is resulting in many persons of moderate means "buying" small plots that they will find out they really do not own, according to a warning given out today by the regional planning commission.

Failure of some sub-division owners to have maps of their plots recorded as required by law today resulted in one complaint being placed in the hands of the district attorney's office for prosecution.

"By failure to record their maps in accordance with the law, sub-dividers are causing many persons to erect homes and other buildings on lots they really did not buy," Charles D. Clark, subdivision engineer, stated.

Here is the law which the commission asserts is being violated: "It shall be unlawful for any subdivider to contract for the sale, to sell or offer to sell any subdivision or part thereof until a map has been duly recorded in the office of the county recorder in which any portion of said subdivision is located, or until he shall record a receipt from the regional planning commission that such map has been submitted to that body for approval."

Many subdivisions in unincorporated territory are being sold in violation of the California Map Act, passed in 1929, Clark stated.

Adjust the diet to your needs by taking smaller or larger portions of the food indicated in plain type. Do not change the quantities of the foods in bold face type. These are the protective foods, and must be taken as indicated.

BREAKFAST

- Orange juice.....100
Breakfast cereal (1 tsp. sugar, 1/2 glass milk).....175
Coffee (milk instead of cream, no sugar).....25
1 cup spinach with poached egg (small lump butter).....150
3 saltine crackers.....50
Hot tea with lemon (no sugar).....100
1 apple or banana.....100

DINNER

- 1/2 cup cream of asparagus soup.....100
Small serving of broiled mackerel.....100
1 cup stewed tomatoes.....50
Medium serving broccoli.....25
Lettuce salad with 1/2 sliced cucumber and 1/2 tsp. French dressing.....125
Small piece apple pie.....100
1 glass of milk.....150

To reduce too fast is dangerous. A quarter of a pound a day is enough.


