

Special Court Order Needed to Permit Operation

A special act of the superior court was necessitated in order that William L. Johnson, 14-year-old Gardena high school boy, might undergo an operation late last week at the Orthopaedic hospital in Los Angeles.

Before the hospital would perform the operation, which resulted from injuries received in a football game, the consent of a guardian was necessary. It was stated, as the boy's father is dead and his mother is confined to a hospital, his grandmother, Mrs. Nora L. Bacon, filed the necessary petition in probate court. Less than an hour afterward, the court had signed the order appointing her as William's guardian, and the hospital proceeded to perform the operation.

The injuries consisted of a broken shoulder and collar bone, and the court was told the operation was necessary immediately in order to save the boy's life.
