

S. P. Improves Train Service To Mexico City

Through Pullmans Three Times a Week to Southern Capital

Improved train schedules over the Southern Pacific of Mexico, between Nogales and Guadalajara, providing tri-weekly through Pullman car service between Los Angeles and Mexico City, instead of twice a week, will go into effect Sunday, January 7.

Increasing travel in Mexico and through that country to and from Southern California resulted in the new service. It was announced here today by Lawson Overman, district passenger agent of the Southern Pacific Lines.

Sleeping cars will leave Los Angeles for the Mexican capital each Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday, under the new schedule. On three additional days each week mixed train service will be operated south from Nogales, providing service six days a week. Trains will be run in a similar manner north from Mexico City, and Guadalajara.

Wheeler Appeals From Verdict In Land Grant Case

Granted permission to petition for an appeal from his conviction several weeks ago, N. Newkirk Wheeler, found guilty of misuse of the mails in connection with an asserted scheme to defraud applicants for homesteads on old Spanish-Mexican land grants in San Fernando valley and Palos Verdes estates, today had posted a \$10,000 appeal bond.

Wheeler, the only one of four defendants to be found guilty in the trial, has been confined in the Orange county jail since his conviction by a jury in Federal Judge George Cosgrave's court on December 11. It was alleged by the government that the scheme of the defendants resulted in several millions of dollars being lost by homestead seekers.


