

Harry Phillips Is President of Epworth League Conference

Harry Phillips, son of Mr. and Mrs. William G. Phillips, 2023 Andrea avenue, recently elected president of the Southern California Conference of Epworth Leagues, was installed in office last Friday evening, January 12, at a banquet held at the First Methodist church, Glendale.

The affair was attended by a large crowd, including in its list of distinguished guests Dr. J. Coffey, secretary of the Methodist board of education; Bishop James C. Baker, presiding bishop of the California-Nevada-Arizona area, who delivered the principal address of the evening; Glen Grant, assistant superintendent of the Los Angeles playgrounds, who led in community singing.

Bishop Baker installed the new officers, who will have charge of the affairs of the Epworth League conference affairs for a wide territory which includes all of the state of Arizona and the southern half of California from Fresno to San Diego.

Harry, who is now a student at Whittier College where he is social chairman of the college Y. M. C. A., is a graduate of Torrance high school.

He has been actively engaged in Epworth League affairs for several years. He was formerly alliance president, president of the Long Beach district for two years, and fourth vice president of the conference, prior to his election to the head office in this department.

Traffic Check Twice a Month CWA Project

Traffic in every community in the county which is being checked twice monthly now is being done as a Civil Works project instead of as an unemployment relief project. It was announced today by the regional planning commission.

As a result of the transfer of the project to the CWA, the traffic checkers now receive \$1.10 an hour.

The regional planning body began its county-wide traffic check last August 17. Since that time, a crew of men has been in the field continually counting the number of vehicles of every description that pass some important intersection in a 12-hour period.

This extended survey, according to Charles D. Clark, subdivision engineer, will provide the highway division of the commission with exact knowledge of the traffic load that is carried by the various highways of the county.

This traffic count has an entirely different objective than the proposed state traffic survey, Clark pointed out, and the state project would not overlap the county survey.


