Continuing the policy of equipping the officers' quarters with modern conveniences, the war department has awarded a contract to the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company through its Washington, D. C. office for 1487 electric refrigerators.

"These refrigerators, of six and nine cubic foot sizes, will be installed in 30 army posts extending from the Atlantic to the Pacific coast and from the Canadian border to the Mexican boundary," Mr. Scott explained.

"Models selected by the government officials were of the 'C' line, recently announced by the Westinghouse company. These models were subjected to various tests, by the officials' directing the purchase. A group of war department engineers headed up by J. R. Gramm, senior engineer, construction division, office quartermaster general, U. S. war department, visited the East Springfield plant of the Westinghouse company to complete the tests and make final arrangements for the shipment of the electric refrigerators."

Most of the vacationists, remain in Mexico from two to four weeks.
