CWA Workers Must Turn In Their Vouchers

SAN FRANCISCO.—A request for publicity has come from Captain Edward Macauley, Federal Civil Works Administrator in San Francisco, and the state auditor, W. M. Sanborn, which this paper is glad to comply with. Many vouchers for CWA work have not been turned in. Will every person in this county having such vouchers immediately turn them in to the local director? This will enable the state administration to close its books and will thereby release money for local circulation, a most important factor in present economic conditions. Put these vouchers in the hands of the local directors by April 23, and do not send them to the San Francisco head office.

It must be understood this request does not apply to vouchers rendered but which have not been paid. The latter are being put through as rapidly as is humanly possible, taking into consideration government red tape. More than 50,000 payrolls covering up to February 8 have already been audited. The total will approximate 80,000.
