Correspondence game, Easterner vs. the writer, continued: Easterner—White Paul—Black 1. P-K4 P-K4 2. Kt-KB3 Kt-QB3 3. B-B4 B-B4 4. P-QK4 B-K4 5. P-QB3 B-K4 6. P-Q4 P-Q3

This is the normal continuation for both sides, and is in strict accord with the Steinitz principle of developing a solid pawn structure at the center. If my opponent had played 6... O-O, then 6... P-Q3; 7. P-Q4, B-K4; permitting Black to transpose into the Lasker Defense, giving him a solid game and possibilities for a strong counter-attack. Black also has at his disposal 6... Pxp; 7. O-O, B-K4; 8... Pxp, P-Q3, which is known as the "Normal Position."

International Chess News The world championship match between Dr. A. Alekhine, champion, and E. Bogoljubow, contender, recently terminated finds the doctor still ensconced upon the coveted throne. The score: Dr. Alekhine 6, Bogoljubow 1, and 17 draws.

One must be hard and cold as stone indeed not to experience at least a tug at the heartstrings when reading of the world-wide efforts to create a fund as a tribute to Dr. Emanuel Lasker in recognition of his long service in the ancient game. He wore the world champion's crown undisturbed for 27 consecutive years, when he was finally dethroned by the Cuban grand master, Capablanca. The aged master is now retired from active play, resides in Holland, and on December 24, next, hopes to celebrate his 66th birthday.

What do the masters of the world do for a living when not actually engaged in "pushing wood?"

Dr. Alekhine is a lawyer in Paris; Capablanca is a consular agent in New York; Dr. Lasker, is a professor of mathematics in Holland; the late Dr. Tarrasch, was a physician in Germany; Flohr is a newspaper man in Czechoslovakia; Kashdan is a magazine publisher in New York; Kupchik is a film salesman. Duke is a

seafarer out of Portland; Borochow, the California state champion, is an insurance broker in Los Angeles; Patterson is an auditor in Los Angeles; Dr. Griffith is a surgeon in Beverly Hills; and Fink is with the interstate commerce commission in San Francisco. Yes, even we, would like to know how they do it!

Guard us carefully against the loss of a move or the loss of ground covered as you would against the loss of a piece.

Chess Oddities Dr. Alekhine played 21 opponents simultaneously while blindfolded, and on the very next day recalled each move, 1500, without error! Paul Morphy never started a chess game with 1. P-Q4!
