Billion Dollar Appraisal Task Board's Problem

An idea of the gigantic task that faces the State Board of Equalization during the next few months was given today by the local chairman of the board, H. G. Castell. He said, the board will be obliged to assess utility property in the state valued in excess of \$1,000,000,000. Appraisal of this property by the Equalization Board is necessitated, it was explained, by the new constitutional provision for taxing utilities, which goes into effect on January 1. The new law abandons the present method, in existence since 1910, of separating the sources of state and local revenue, and returns utility property to city and county tax rolls, to be taxed in the same manner as other property.
