Peace, Topic of Speech Sunday At Bible Class

In addition to the address there will be a beautiful patriotic feature service consisting of a series of bugle calls, pledge to the flag and the national anthem. The calls will be sounded off by Bugler Howe, a local boy. The singing of several patriotic songs by the congregation will follow.

Other features will include a pulse quartet, a reading and a vocal solo, all patriotic selections. The teacher of the class said: "We want the people who read this announcement to consider it a personal invitation to attend this special session of the Bible Class, a session in memory of the science and those who are living."

Mr. Barnett was a native of England, but came to the United States when he was a small boy. He had lived in Torrance for the past 18 years.

He leaves two daughters, Mrs. Clara Baxter, 1221 Acacia, and Mrs. Frank Reed, of Los Angeles, and one son, Arthur L. Barnett, of Huntington, West Virginia.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, November 6, from the Neil & Towne Mortuary, Los Angeles. Rev. Wm. H. Fellow, conducting religious rites. Interment was made at Roosevelt Memorial Park for both men and women.
