Last Round-up of Master Minds Ends Saturday

Hinds Maintains Supremacy As Best Picker of Scores

The last round-up Saturday of the Herald's Master Minds of the football season gave the sports editor a chance to make back some of the points lost in a disastrous slide on Thanksgiving Day. The standing for the games of December 1 was: Fraser, 75; Lewellen, 88; Hinds, 104; Murphy, 144. All of the experts took a toss on the Xavier-Morehouse game, which went to the latter by a big score. Hinds ran true to form in picking the U.S.C.-Washington game on the nose, but lost six out of ten picks. Lewellen and Murphy tied with five out of ten and the sports editor came through handsomely with seven winners.

Eight Graduates Disrupt Gaucho Football Squad

Coach Ben Comrada of the Narbonne Gauchos will have another tough season ahead of him next year, since his present football team is practically disrupted with the graduation of eight varsity men at the end of the year. The eight are Gould, Rider and Cheek in the backfield, and Ramsey, Carpenter, Anzelleh, Joe Hamlam and Dunstan in the line. All of these boys were heartbreaks, and their loss will leave some mighty big holes for Comrada to fill. Much of the Gauchos' indifferent showing this season was due to the fact that four of these boys were handicapped by injuries. Dunstan being forced out in mid-season.

Be that as it may, Comrada has faced similar situations and has come through with a winning team, so it is entirely too early to predict what may happen next fall when the Gauchos start to ramble again.

Total scores for the series are: Hinds, 358; Lewellen, 493; Fraser, 627; Murphy, 647. The standings are based on the ability of the picker to come closest to the actual scores made in the games. Total number of winners picked for the series indicates that the wisdom of the experts was about on a par. For the 11 predictions, Lewellen headed the list with 76 winners; Hinds second with 74; Murphy third, 74; Fraser low with 69. Out of the 109 games, one being cancelled, the percentages are: Lewellen, 71; Hinds, 68; Murphy, 67; Fraser, 65. Hinds gained on the pack by picking his scores with skill and judgment, and had a number of exact scores to his credit, which placed him way out in front.
