Jones Appointed Head of County Surveyor's Dept.

Work of the county surveyor's department in this community and other sections of the county hereafter will be under the direction of Alfred Jones, widely-known chief deputy who was named county surveyor by unanimous action of the board of supervisors Friday.
Jones, who is known to every city engineer in the county, was named on motion of Supervisor Robert W. Jessup after the resignation of County Surveyor J. E. Rockhold had been presented to the board. The resignation was found locked in a compartment of Rockhold's desk when odd circumstances caused office employees to fear for his welfare. A note attached to it directed his secretary to present it to the supervisors on December 20.
The county surveyor's office prepares all assessment maps for the county assessor, whether they be inside or outside municipalities. The office also drafts plans and specifications under the County Improvement Act, the Street and District Improvement Act and the Sewer Maintenance District Act, and others. Title searches are made of deeds given the road department for rights-of-way, and of deeds presented to the charities department as security for aid.

The wrecked car was registered to Alfred Sarpa, 233 Fifth street, San Bernardino, and the check, noted at the sheriff's substation 3 as "hot," is said to have been given in a deal for the transfer of ownership.
