## MANY AREAS ARE brilliant with SPRING FLOWERS

Thousands of motorists take to the road each week-end, attracted by the exceptional display of wild flowers, which are unusually numerous this year due to the heavy rains of the past few months. Among the most popular is the Arvin section, and the San Joaquin valley, where millions of lupines, poppies and sun cups make a vivid display.

The ocotillo, brilliant red flower, is blooming in the Borego valley, between Julian, San Diego county, and Kane Springs. Desert lilacs, rarest of arid area blossoms, are out in abundance about Kane Springs, and cactus blossoms enhance the landscape.

Many varieties of flowers are in bloom about Lake Elsinore, Carlsbad, and the hills from Laguna to Torrey Pines are brilliant with coreopsis. Ocotillo and incensia are found between Jacumba and Coyote Wells. Wild lilac is beginning to bloom in the mountains and canyons.

Desert blossoms, such as the verbena and scarlet incensia, are appearing in the Palm Springs area with Spanish bayonet in bloom for the first time in 14 years between Banning and Whitewater.

Other desert areas where many flowers are to be found are in the vicinity of Randsburg, and in Death Valley.


