The services will be held each Sunday afternoon beginning at 5 o'clock and continuing approximately one hour. On Sunday, August 4, Rev. O. D. Wonder of the Central Evangelical church will be the speaker. On August 11, Rev. Kemp Winkler of the Methodist church will speak, and on August 18, Rev. George Elder of the Christian church will be the minister. The closing service on August 25 will have Rev. C. M. Northrup of the Baptist church as the speaker.

A large volunteer choir will sing and the various churches will also furnish special musical numbers. These Sunday vesper services are not simply for the members of the various churches but for all the citizens of Torrance. "Let us exhibit a civic pride in these vesper services that shall make them increasingly popular with all our people," says Rev. Wonder. "Be present next Sunday and every Sunday throughout the month of August."




