


TIMELY RECIPE TIPS




GINGER BREAD

1/2 cup shortening, add 2 cups sugar and cream well. Beat egg and one cup molasses. Sift flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon ginger, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon and alternately to first mixture 1 cup boiling water. Pour in pan lined with greased paper. Bake 45 minutes in moderate oven.




POUND CAKE

One pound each of flour, and eggs, 3/4 pound butter, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 teaspoon mace. Cream the flour with the butter and sugar. Beat yolks of eggs and sugar. Add the beaten and remaining flour. When done, mix well, beating half hour.



MEAT LOAF

One 2 pounds of ground beef with one pound ground pork. Add one onion, grated, crushed cracker crumbs. Season and add 1 slightly beaten egg in loaf. Pour over contents of No. 2 can tomato juice. Bake in moderate oven.



RAISED DOUGHNUTS

1/2 cup boiling milk, 2 cups sugar, 1/2 pint yeast and 1/2 pint water. Beat eggs, butter and sugar. Then pour in milk. Let rise, then the last rising. After doughnuts are cut out, fry in hot fat. Sift with powdered sugar.



PRUNE SALAD

Cooked halved prunes with cheese mixed with nut garnish with maraschino and serve on head lettuce, crosswise. Serve with dressing.



BREAKFAST GEMS

1/2 cup flour, 1/2 teaspoon powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup water, 1/2 cup seedless raisins. Bake 15 minutes.



SHRIMP SALAD

Use fresh or canned shrimps drained in French dressing. Serve with mayonnaise and sliced stuffed olives on beds.






Patties of cornbeef hash, top each with a poached egg, seasoned.
