Fight For Local Option

Looms In California As Drys Show Surprising Strength

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 20 (U.P.)—With repeal not yet three years old, California at the November elections will become one of the first battlegrounds in the Union for the return to local option as a stepping stone to prohibition.

Using the California "initiative" law, drys, under the leadership of the Anti-Saloon League, have won their first skirmish in the fight. By obtaining 190,000 signatures to an initiative petition they have succeeded in forcing the submission at the next election of a proposed amendment to the constitution, repealing, first, everything pertaining to liquor control and substituting for it a single sentence providing for local option.

This one sentence reads: "Every city, town, county, city and county, or territory outside of incorporated cities and towns, shall have the power to regulate, zone, or prohibit the sale of alcoholic beverages, within its limits."

Although only 166,378 signatures were necessary to make the petition for the submission of the proposed amendment to popular vote obligatory, dry, for good measure, obtained a total of 199,327.

Liquor Abuses Admitted
The fight, however, is not to be a one-sided one on a single clear-cut issue, for wets sponsored an initiative petition that will place on the ballot a proposed amendment correcting admitted abuses that arose under the system of liquor control.

In the event drys should win at the November election and their constitutional amendment become effective, it would take the liquor control entirely out of the hands of the state.

The proposed amendment of wets has the double purpose of preventing this and at the same time correcting a situation which they themselves admit is deplorable.

Initiative for the latter first was taken by the League of California Municipalities and other civic bodies but later was carried out by hotel and liquor interests who desire a better regulated system than the present one.

At present California's liquor control is invested in the state board of equalization. Against its administration many complaints of allegedly arbitrary and unfair treatment have been made by small liquor dealers, cafe owners and others.

Wets Favor New Body
To meet this situation, wets propose taking the control of the liquor situation out of the hands of the board of equalization and investing it in a newly created liquor commission of three members. The first board would be constituted by the appointment for two years of one member by the governor, one by the attorney general and one by the lieutenant governor.

Following the creation of the first board, the members afterward would be appointed by the governor for terms of six years, the appointments subject to confirmation by a two-third vote of the senate, while incumbents could be removed by two-thirds votes of both houses.

This new commission would have power to limit the number of licenses in any district. It also would make issuance of licenses more strict. Local authorities would have a greater voice in connection with issuance and cancellation of licenses.

Open Hearings Proposed
Before a license could be issued, the application would have to be submitted to the local law-making body. In the event of a protest against, the commission could not issue it until a public hearing was held in the locality where the protest originated.

Similarly the commission would have to hold a hearing in event local officials protested that a license was being abused. By thus establishing a local control over issuance of licenses wets hope in this initial fight with the drys to avoid the fundamental issue that has always been one of the greatest controversial questions in California, that of local option.

Should both the local option amendment and the proposed wet amendment providing for a reorganization of state control be adopted, the constitution provides that the amendment which receives the highest vote shall prevail.

As a consequence, the fight of the local option supporters will narrow down to getting out a larger vote than the wet element, which still wants to retain liquor, but under more rigid control.

Pheasant Crop In Minnesota Braves Drouth

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (U.P.)

—Minnesota's nimrods are assured a good pheasant hunting season next fall, despite this summer's severe drouth, according to Dr. Ralph Wing of the game management division of University of Minnesota farm. Wing said recent inspection tours through the pheasant hunting areas of northern Minnesota indicated that the drouth has had little effect on the pheasant population because of good nesting conditions last spring.

Young pheasants went into the dry summer months in excellent condition and most were able to shift for themselves by the time the drouth became severe, said Wing. He believes birds will suffer only in areas where all feed has been burned out. But Minnesota, he explained, has escaped most of the intense, crop-killing drouth.


