Mary Brooks Picken, 285 Madison avenue, New York. Patou's fall collection is the finest in the tradition of the house. He uses lovely materials and exquisite finishes and the entire collection expresses true chic. Smoke blue and arbois red are the new colors of this house which uses much satin and broadcloth for day wear. One cloth dress has a lace yoke in wool thread lace. Evening hats have amusing veils dipping low over the face or with ruffled trims. Velvet hats with pointed crowns have face veils to the nose repeated from the tip of the crown point in back. One felt hat actually has two round veils of heavily dotted chenille descending from the back of the crown to the waist.

Patou shows also many evening headresses with sweeping veils starting from a crown of flowers or feathers. In dresses he uses black net worked in bands in a widening skirt. In the same way he uses close patterned insertion to outline a square neck and this is repeated in rows on the skirt. He also uses chantilly lace and chiffon in alternating bands. Another dress featuring lattice bands with black sequins has a long cape of double net. Gilets for tailored suits have narrow lace edgings. Worth collection includes a black net appliqued with silk designs.

Norman Hartnell of London held showing in Paris. Shows a rust colored wool lace jumper with a bottle tweed suit. He uses much lace and tulle in widening skirts and features shirred bands in voluminous skirt bottoms. He also uses all colors in tulle in models with drop shoulders and big ruches, and has one model in black and white lace with velvet bands in the skirt. Shows a beige lace blouse with a blue cloth skirt.

Wanda Koffler in her collection of hand knits has silk evening coats knitted in all lace stitches, including Venice, fish, binche, and rosepoint.


