

Evening High SCHOOL

In the typing class almost every machine had an operator working at it the whole two hours on Monday night.

So many are asking for a computer that it will be necessary to schedule the time very carefully so that everyone will get their turn at the machines. The shorthand classes are divided into two sections, from 7 to 8 beginning shorthand is being taught, and from 8 to 9 the more advanced students are given dictation and other training. A nice group has enrolled for each class. If you are interested in one of these classes it will be wise for you to start as early as possible.

The classes in sewing, wood and machine shop, beauty culture have a very good start with the students enthusiastic over their work. Principal Guy Mowry would like to see more of the people of Torrance and Lomita taking advantage of these opportunities. Four new classes were started on Monday night. A class in dramatics will meet from 8 to 9:30 on Monday and Wednesday nights, one in public speaking from 6:30 to 8 on the same evenings. English and mathematics are two more classes to meet from 6:30 to 9:30 on Monday and Wednesday evenings.

Three more classes are planned to start about the first of October. Announcement of them will be made at a later date.

"BOOTLEG OR SALOON"



hours and 629, or 12 percent, related to improving safety conditions in the mills.
Other matters brought up by the employees dealt with various phases of working conditions. About 7 1/2 percent of the questions concerned those physical conditions within the plants which affect production and the comfort of employees on the job, while other questions related to sanitation, employees' transportation, housing, and living conditions, pensions, etc.
So that their constituents would receive as prompt action as possible upon the matters presented, the representatives elected by the employees of the various plants of the industry held 3422 meetings from January through June of this year, an average of 22 meetings per working day for the whole industry.
