

Odd Accident Injures Man

Sam Gourley, 608 So. Guadalupe, Redondo Beach, is being treated at the Jared Sidney Torrance Memorial hospital this week for severe injuries received yesterday in an odd accident on the state highway near Waleria. Gourley's car was being pushed by another machine driven by Pat Kinney, 931 W. 11st street, and when the engine finally turned over and Gourley was able to proceed under his own power he turned his head to locate the pusher car. His machine ran into the curb and turned over, pinning Gourley underneath. He received severe friction abrasions and possible fractured ribs. Stone & Myers ambulance was called to remove him to the hospital.
