SHOE STYLES INTRODUCE CORONATION FASHIONS



Edward VIII Inspires New Style Trend; Experts Stress Care of Materials

THE advance showing of fall shoes and accessories, introduced in Hollywood this year for the first time prior to the New York style showings, points the way toward so-called "coronation" fashions that will have all the charm of the gay days of Edward VII combined with the chic that characterizes the taste of Edward VIII.

While still Prince of Wales, the latter was noted for his preference for the modern and sophisticated. Hence the new footwear, which stylists see as definitely indicative of a fashion trend, is not only dramatically different in design, but stresses the importance of fabric-elegance, always synonymous with sophisticated fashion.

Foremost among fall shoe styles are "rotator" boots—a sort of modified high shoe. Screen stars acclaimed them as the cleverest innovation in footwear since the amazing popularity achieved by the sandal. Coming just to the ankle, they revive memories of the high lace boot of the era of the 18th century. However, the styling is much simpler and gives the foot an appearance of elegance and sophistication that will be a graceful supplement to suavely molded fall costumes. Elegance of material is not limited to the new boots, since sandals, pumps, brogues and monk adaptations are also shown in fine suedes and soft finished leathers.

Suede and suede-like fabrics in both shoes and accessories require careful grooming if they are to maintain their velvety freshness, according to Ruth Kerr, leading

New York shoe stylist and fashion adviser to the makers of Shinola shoe dressings. This is especially true, she emphasizes, in the case of the vivid new suede colors—ox-blood, Chaudron, the high brown that takes its name from a copper kettle, and green. She says a common mistake in the care of suede shoes is the custom of brushing them with a wire brush. Instead, a regulation bristle brush, such as a small nail brush, should be used. This type of bristle will loosen the nap but not scratch or wear off even the most delicate finish.

"After the shoe has been thoroughly brushed, a light coating of a liquid suede cleaner in the proper color should be applied. Such a cleaner revitalizes the leather and restores pigment as it cleans. When dry, the shoes should again be brushed lightly to fluff up the nap. The woman who takes a little time each day to 'manicure' her shoes will find herself amply repaid," says Miss Kerr, "for the woman who is as fastidious about the care she gives her winter shoes and accessories as she is in choosing them may be sure that her wardrobe will remain smart and fresh looking throughout the season."

PARIS. (U.P.)—The new Schiaparelli silhouette is a youthful one with slender, narrow skirts that are a bit shorter than last year, and trimly tailored shoulders. The waistline is usually placed normally, although numerous evening gowns have a higher, almost Empire waist.

Hats are higher than ever. The favorite street model looks quite like a miner's cap. For cocktail, dressy afternoon or restaurant dining, Schiaparelli shows ornate hats of feathers. Several are patterned after the tall bear skin hats worn by British guards—but they are naturally made of fine ostrich feathers.

Tiny little caps are shown with evening gowns. For example, a dress of bright green velvet is worn with a tiny round cap of green velvet that is fitted at the back of the head and held in place by a long gilt dagger-shaped pin.

The newest Schiaparelli shade is a bright circus pink which is called "Parlor Pink" in the new collection. It is used for smart little evening mittens (with the fingers cut out). Made in velvet, the "Parlor Pink" mittens match bright evening slippers and are worn with a gown of draped gold lame.

Red still is a dominant shade in the new collection, while one of the new combinations shows lemon yellow for fur trimming a black wool spring coat. Pale blue is combined with scarlet for spring wear and gold braid and spangles trim black.
