Scientific Treasures From Observatory Used In Film

(Continued From Page 4-B) are played there is insufficient time for the teams to take batting and fielding practice before either the first or second game. This is very important to the players. With two games being played the second game ends between 10:30 and 11:00 o'clock. This is too late for the fans and players alike. With one game being played it should end about 9:30. It would be more comfortable for the players and fans as it sometimes gets too cool after that hour to be comfortable.

2. That better umpiring be furnished. (This is a matter for the league officials and the managers to handle and nothing personal is intended.) Believe that umpires experienced in umpiring softball and specializing in that game only would solve the problem.

3. That the city council be asked to furnish additional money for the lighting expense that would be required for single games. The approximate cost of the lighting for the games attended by the 14470 people last year was \$140.00 or less than 1 cent per person. This money was donated by the city council. Don't you think that was a very good investment for city funds?

4. That the game as played last year be retained. (That is the length of the bases, size of the ball, etc.) Some fans and a few players would possibly like to see the game changed to 60 foot bases and a 12-inch ball. This game was played the night of the benefit game between a Los Angeles team and a Torrance league all-star team. Contend that the above mentioned game is not softball as it eliminates bunting which is one of the most exciting and spectacular plays in softball. The 60 foot base game puts a premium on slugging and straightaway hitting and eliminates the player who depends on his ability to bounce or tap the ball in front of the plate and beat the throw to first. Might say that this game is not a Southern California game but was imported from the Middle West under the
