

FOOD FOR FATHER

This year Father's Day falls on June 20th. Don't forget him and his day. Never mind the delicate salads, tiny fruit cups and dainty desserts. Dad wants the delicate foundation—none of your "francy" dishes.

So here are recipes that fill the bill on this particular holiday:

Ripe Olive Hodge Podge

- 1 cup sliced ripe olives
1/2 cup flaked red salmon
1 cup drained whole kernel corn
1/2 cups crumbled soda crackers
1/2 cup finely cut green sweet pepper

Salt Pepper

- 1 1/2 cups white sauce
2 eggs
6 thin slices orange

Combine olives, salmon, corn, cracker crumbs, green pepper, salt and pepper to taste and blend. Combine white sauce and beaten eggs and mix. Pour over olive-salmon mixture and blend well. Pour into a buttered casserole or baking pan and place orange slices over top. Bake in a hot oven (400 degrees F.) 30 minutes. Serves 6.

Che-Braz

- 1 1/2 cups flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon paprika
1/2 teaspoon mustard
Dash of cayenne
1/2 cup shortening

Cold water about 2 tablespoons

- 1 1/2 cups cheese, rubbed through a strainer
1 egg white
1/2 cup sliced Brazil nuts

Mix and sift the flour, baking powder and seasonings. Cut in the shortening and when the mixture is well blended, add cold water to make a stiff dough. Roll into thin sheet, sprinkle with cheese and make three folds. Turn dough one-fourth way round, roll thin, sprinkle with another layer of cheese and make three folds. Repeat until

cheese is used. After the final rolling, the dough should be about one eighth inch thick. Cut into fancy shapes, brush with egg white and sprinkle with sliced Brazil nuts. Bake on an ungreased baking sheet in a hot oven, 450 degrees F., eight to ten minutes. Serve with cocktails or with salad.

Hawaiian Raisin Pie

- 1 egg, well beaten
1 cup sugar
4 tablespoons corn starch
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
3 tablespoons lemon juice
1/2 cup seedless raisins

(soaked for two hours in cold water)

1 1/2 cups Hawaiian-pineapple juice
1/2 cup water
To well beaten egg add sifted dry ingredients, mix until smooth and add grated lemon rind and juice. Mix pineapple juice and water and stir into egg mixture. Add drained raisins. Cook over hot water until thick and clear, about 20 minutes, stirring constantly at first and then occasionally. Cool and pour into a baked ten-inch pie shell. Top with meringue made of three egg whites and 6 tablespoons of sugar or serve with whipped cream. If meringue topping is used, bake until puffy and golden brown in a moderately slow oven (325 degrees F.).

Miracle Cake
4 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
4 1/2 teaspoons K. C. Baking Powder
1 cup Crisco
1 1/2 cups Mayfair milk
2 cups sugar
2 teaspoons Ben-Hur vanilla
1/2 teaspoon salt
4 eggs, well beaten
Method: Sift the flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt and sift three times.

Cream Crisco and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs and mix well. Add flour alternately with milk, small amount at a time. Add vanilla. Divide into three parts. With one-third make the apricot upside down cake to be served that day. Then turn the remaining batter into 2 pans as directed in recipe. Cover each closely with damp cloth and waxed paper and store in electric refrigerator

until ready to bake. A tin lid may be used as a cover.
Apricot Upside Down Cake
1/2 recipe miracle cake
18 Iris apricot halves
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup melted butter
Method: Melt butter in loaf pan 9 by 5 or 8-inch square pan. Add sugar and apricot halves and pour over 1/2 basic recipe batter. Put in cold electric oven,

set temperature control at 375° and bake 45-60 minutes. May be baked with oven meal.
Savory Macaroni
1/2 cup Pompeian olive oil
1 pound Wilson's Certified ground beef.
1 onion sliced
2 cups dry macaroni
4 cups Iris tomato pulp and juice
Ben-Hur garlic salt

Ben-Hur celery salt
Ben-Hur chili powder
2 drops tabasco sauce
Method: Brown meat and onion in olive oil in skillet. Add

macaroni and tomato mixed with other ingredients, let come to steam with switch on high. Then turn to off and let cook on free heat 30 minutes.

Tax Extension Slows Payments

Action of Governor Merriam in signing the bill extending until May 20, 1938, the date to pay delinquent taxes on the 10-cent ment plan caused a let-down in payments to the county tax collector's office last month. It was reported this week. Heavy payments are expected between now and September 1, however, as until that date delinquent taxes may be paid without penalties or interest, according to T. E. Tanner, chief of the tax redemption division of the office. Governor Merriam signed the bill extending the time on April 19. Payments during May totaled only \$835,749, as compared with \$764,795 in April, the previous month. May payments this year were only about 40 percent of the \$1,540,839 paid in during

May of 1936. For the fiscal year to date, payments total \$8,525,545, as compared to \$8,954,600 for the similar months of 1936.
