Perfume Project in Alondra Park May be Okayed

Alondra Park, north of Torrance, will be the site of a novel experiment, that of growing perfume-producing flowers, if the Board of Supervisors officially provide \$25,000 from the \$1,000,000 set aside in the county budget for WPA projects to help finance the project. Tentative approval of the proposal has already been given by the supervisors.

Monroe Kidder, flower expert, told the board recently that perfume could be produced in Southern California as a commercial venture. Development of the plan, it is claimed by its proponents, would result in bringing added millions in income to the state and create employment for many persons now on relief.

According to the proposed plan, the Federal government would be asked to furnish \$160,000 and board members believe that the WPA authorities would look favorably on such a project if it held out an opportunity for employment of a sufficient number of relief

workers. The plan calls for setting out some 2,000 beds of flowers in the Alondra Park vicinity with an educational program to teach adults proper methods of growing flowers in their home gardens for commercial use.

Permitted by Law
 The recent Legislature adopted a law making it permissible for the Supervisors to contribute to this experimental work with plants, trees and flowers, so that their value may be determined for the manufacture of perfume and drugs.

At present the United States imports \$25,000,000 of perfume and perfume products from foreign countries. The Supervisors have been told in support of the local experiment.

It is claimed that Los Angeles County could raise sufficient flowers to offset the necessity of going to foreign countries for perfume materials.

ORDINANCE NO. 286

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE FIXING THE TAX RATES AND LEVYING TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1937.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising the sums of money necessary to be raised by taxation upon the taxable property of the City of Torrance as a revenue to carry on the various Departments of said City for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1937, the rates of taxes for the different portions of the City of Torrance are hereby fixed and taxes are hereby levied on all taxable property in the different portions of the City for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1937, in the number of cents upon each one hundred dollars of the assessed value of said property as assessed by the County Assessor and equalized by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, and for the several funds and purposes set forth in the following table, the taxes levied upon property in each portion of said City hereinafter described and designated by a district number being at the rates set opposite the designations of the respective funds in the column headed by the district number, which is prefixed to the description of such portion of said city as hereinafter stated.

DISTRICT NO. 1. All that portion of the City of Torrance included within the boundaries thereof as originally incorporated.

DISTRICT NO. 2. All that territory annexed to the City of Torrance at the following annexation elections, to-wit:

- (a) December 8, 1925, West Torrance
- (b) Feb. 9, 1926, Northwest Torrance
- (c) Jan. 25, 1927, Meadow Park
- (d) March 12, 1928, Walther
- (e) Sept. 10, 1929, Halbusch Tract, and
- (f) May 26, 1931, South Torrance.

TOTAL GENERAL TAX RATE

Section 2. That in addition to the foregoing taxes there is hereby levied on all taxable land in the Act of 1927 Municipal Improvement District No. 1 of said City of Torrance, as said district is described in Ordinance of Intention of said City No. 208, which said ordinance is hereby referred to and made a part hereof, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1937, the sum of fifty-five (55) cents upon each one hundred dollars of the assessed value of said property as assessed by the County Assessor and equalized by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, for a bond sinking fund, such assessed valuation of such property being the sum of \$1,790,460.00.

Section 3. That the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety require that this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption. The facts constituting such urgency are as follows. That statutes, in such cases made and provided, prescribe that the above tax rates must be certified to the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County, California, not later than the 27th day of August, 1937; that in event thirty days is allowed to elapse after the adoption of this ordinance before the same becomes effective, said last mentioned date will have passed and no tax rate will have been adopted and no taxes levied for the operation of said City and payment of said interest and principal of said bonds during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1937, and if no taxes are levied or collected said City will not be able to function or pay said interest and principal of said bonds, all of which would menace the public peace, health and safety of said City.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper printed, published and circulated in the City of Torrance, and immediately upon its adoption the same shall be in full force and effect.

Walnut Street Extension Is Advanced

For the extension of Walnut street in Lomita, a project which has been in various stages of negotiations for the past two years right-of-way was acquired by the county road department late last week from West 240th street.

Further complications may be a bar to improvement within the near future, according to H. H. Halladay, secretary of the Lomita Chamber of Commerce. The Union Oil company holds a pipeline right-of-way for the entire length of the street on the east side and projected paving must await a right-of-way grant from that concern.

Must Lower Pipes

The county cannot obtain a clear title to the street until the oil company so desires, it is reported. County engineer's specifications state that pipes must be laid at a given depth below the surface of the established street. The pipes in question are too near the surface to meet the requirements, Halladay states.

Lowering the line would cost approximately \$3,500, which would probably have to be met by the county road department. The oil company acquired the right-of-way while the land was still private property, Halladay said.
