NEW BUICKS FEATURE COIL SPRINGS



The last heritage of the buggy—the leaf spring—is discarded by the 1938 Buick. The new models (above, the special five-passenger four door sedan) which will be formally presented Saturday, Oct. 16, by the Prewett Motor Sales, local Buick headquarters at 1629 Cabrillo avenue, complete the revolution of ride control begun when Buick introduced kneaction.

Introduction of coil springs in the rear to match and balance similar front springs already in use in more than a million cars is one of the outstanding innovations of the new Buick. Another is the "turbulator" piston which controls burning of the fuel mixture at higher compressions and at the same time increases performance of Buick's valve-in-head, straight-eight engine eight per cent with a relative gain in gasoline mileage.

In addition to the new spring suspension, a different method of body mounting at points of minimum frame vibration and the use of special insulation further contribute to riding comfort as well as dampening "drumming" noises. The new mounting also frees the body from twisting strains under extreme road conditions.

Buick for 1938 also presents a new self-shifting transmission as optional in the Special series. The new transmission is the result of years' research and development and is produced in a special \$5,000,000 plant at the Buick factory in Flint, Michigan. Centrifugally and hydraulically controlled, the transmission automatically does its own shifting and adds a fourth speed.

The new rear springs are exclusive in the new Buick and are made possible only by Buick's torque-tube and radius rod construction. The combination of these engineering features, long used by Buick, removes all drive and brake stress from the springs, leaving them free to the one duty of absorbing road shocks.

Riders Unhurt in Truck-Car Crash



NEW WILLYS ON DISPLAY AT JENKINS'

L. James Jenkins, dealer in Willys cars for this area, returned from a general sales convention of Willys dealers in the territory covered by Willys Distributors, Inc., at Los Angeles.

The meeting at Los Angeles was one of a series conducted in all parts of the country in advance of the initial showing of the new Willys for 1938 which is now on display at 1316 Cabrillo avenue. Announcement was made of notable additions to the Willys line, which includes in the passenger car division for the 1938 sales season, a standard, deluxe and economy coupe.

The new sales season also marks the entry of the Willys into the commercial car field with a 1000-pound pick-up and one of 750-pound capacity.

Manufacturing plans call for a schedule increase of production over the 1937 sales season, when 63,465 passenger car units were built of 100 per cent, which will call for approximately 125,000 units.

Operating economy is emphasized in the Willys safes and advertising program, Jenkins stated. During the past year, Willys owners were uniformly reporting up to 35 miles to the gallon under all average driving conditions. Entry of the Willys into the closely competitive low priced car market a year ago, with all models priced substantially lower than the next higher priced car, was one of the features of the automobile industry.

ROAD BUILDING

Approximately 250 miles of county roads will be constructed in California during 1937 and 1938 with federal funds matched by county money.
