

Dual Ballot Plan Sought for Bond Vote

Passage of a law establishing a dual system of voting on bonds will be sought by the Property Owners' Association of California at the coming session of the State Legislature, it was announced this week by H. H. Jarrett, chairman of the board of directors.

Under the provisions of a bill now being prepared by attorneys for the association, the proposed system would follow very closely the one in operation in Nevada. The Nevada law provides that when bond elections are held, two separate ballots are furnished the voters—one for property owners and one for non-property owners.

The ballots are cast in separate ballot boxes, and in order for any bond issue to carry, a majority of both types of voters is required. Thus no bonds may be issued without approval of a majority of property owners.

In addition to the Nevada system, however, the Property Owners' Association measure will carry the proviso that bond issues may be submitted only at regular elections, and a two-thirds majority vote required.
