### Local Independent Stores Report Sales Gains

November retail sales of 4,942 California independent stores increased six percent over October, but showed virtually no change from November, 1937, the department of commerce reported today.

Greatest increase was reported in Inglewood where volume soared 36 1/2 percent from November, 1937. Cities ranging from 50,000 to 100,000 showed the only increases, a four percent average, while the group ranging from 25,000 to 50,000 took a five percent decrease. Areas less than 2,500 counted a four percent decline.

In Torrance, sales showed a gain of 28.5 percent for 12 months and a gain of 7.8 percent from October. Sales for last November were 34.7 percent as against 27 percent for November, 1937, and 32.2 percent for October, 1938.

### Indian Mounds of Minnesota Enrich Study

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (U.P.) — Dr. Lloyd Wilford, head of the University of Minnesota anthropology department, is studying results of excavations of Minnesota Indian mounds in an effort to trace cultural development of Minnesota Indians.

A WPA grant assisted in the work, done by Dr. Wilford and four students. At Spring Lake in northern Minnesota, the group often found mounds in the front yards of homes of more recent Indians. One of the mounds contained 40 skeletons, of which one was found in a sitting position.

### A Soufflé Supper For a Flabby Purse

THE recent festive season no doubt has left your food budget a trifle the worse for wear. So it's not exactly good news when your husband announces that he's bringing home a business friend for a bite of supper! All is not lost, however, for you can make a very handsome main dish of a tomato-chesse soufflé and flank it with broiled bacon. Follow this recipe to the letter and it will be a grand soufflé to win the men folk's beaming approval.

**Tomato Cheese Soufflé**  
3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 cup tomato soup; 1 cup grated American cheese; 3 egg yolks, beaten; 1/2 cup thick and lemon-colored; 3 egg whites, stiffly beaten.

Combine tapioca, salt, and tomato soup in top of double boiler. Place over rapidly boiling water and cook 8 to 10 minutes after water boils again, stirring frequently. Add cheese and stir until melted. Cool slightly while beating egg whites.

Note: Soufflé may be baked in greased ramekin in moderate oven (350° F.) 30 minutes.
