## LOCAL KEGLER ON WINNING L. B. TEAM

Bowling enthusiasts and keglers from many Southland cities jammed the Torrance Bowling Academy to capacity last Sunday to participate and "spectate" in the Southeast District championships. The Hefco Pumps of Long Beach, a five-man team, won major honors and in April will bowl in the A.B.C. championships at Cleveland.

A well-known local bowler, W. T. "Turp" Lohmeyer, purchasing agent at the National Supply plant, was a member of the winning team and high-point man for the squad. Lohmeyer scored 644, while other members points were: Lyman Wakeman, 557; Walter Hollingsworth, 626; Stan Andrews, 628, and Cecil Martin, 581. They rolled 949, 1,029 and 1,075 for their high total of 3,653 to defeat a field of 432 teams from nearly every bowling center in the Southland.

In the Southeast tournament, there were 99 five-man teams; 124 doubles and 199 singles. The All-events' title went to A. U. Schultz of Santa Ana with a score of 2013; doubles to Matt Moore of Lynnwood and K. Noel of Los Angeles, 1300, and the singles to C. Thuling of San Pedro at 732.
