Talks for Students Open to Public at H. S. Next Month

A community conference series on the theme of "Wholesome Living" has been arranged for presentation here next month by the Torrance high school faculty, student body and Torrance Ministerial Union. This series, to be held every Wednesday afternoon and evening during March in the high school assembly hall will be entirely non-sectarian and open to the public.

Religion as an asset in life will be discussed in detail. The talks will be presented in terms of the average student, parent or resident and be based on the fact that religion is a universal concern.

The speakers will be outstanding educators and youth workers of Southern California. The afternoon sessions are planned to encourage the local students to ask questions and leaders will be ready to answer them either by the "question box" method of written queries or oral responses. No adult will be expected to speak during the afternoon meetings until all students who desire to participate have had their opportunity.

Evening speakers will direct their addresses more to adults but all will be urged to attend.

Windstorm Gives City Heavy Dusting Three-Day Gale Causes Small Property Damage Here

Southern California's three-day windstorm that blew itself out last Friday after claiming three lives, causing thousands of dollars damage and forcing housewives to do their spring cleaning earlier than usual, gave Torrance a good dusting but caused little damage within city limits.

Velocities up to 67 miles an hour were reported while the storm was at its roaring height Thursday afternoon and night. Street department crews were busy Friday cleaning up the debris of broken tree branches and shattered signs but actual loss was almost negligible.

The 50-foot flagpole in front of the Torrance Elementary school crashed to the lawn Thursday afternoon, narrowly missing some boys standing near by. One of the small front windows at the Star Department store blew in and the banners suspended over El Prado and Sartori avenue to advertise the opening of the new Safeway market blew down Thursday night.

No oil derricks were toppled here also five in Redondo Beach and the county strip adjoining Torrance crashed to earth. Two fell off Torrance boulevard, the

wreckage of one—a Shell rig near Earl street—extending into the highway. Associated Oil's Watson No. 1 rig near Victor street was the other wreck. Both wells were abandoned holes.

Several power lines were put out of commission in this district, according to C. C. Bartlett, district manager of the Southern California Edison company and many service wires were blown loose from homes. Service was restored, however, within a few hours and the damage did not affect many power patrons.

Would Rewrite Constitution


SACRAMENTO, Feb. 23 (U.P.)—On the contention that California's 60-year-old constitution is outmoded, three bills are before the legislature to call a constitutional convention to rewrite the document.

Authority to call such a convention was granted the legislature in a constitutional amendment approved by the people at the November, 1954, general election, but bills on the subject were defeated by the 1955 and 1957 legislative sessions.

The bills this year were AB96, by Jeanette Dakay, San Diego, and Frederick F. Houser, Alhambra, calling for a convention to meet Oct. 1, 1940, AB, by Fred Reeves, San Pedro, setting the time as the first Monday in February, 1940, AB82, by Joseph P. Gilmore, San Francisco, providing for the convention to start on the first Monday following the constitutional recess of the legislature in 1941.

Each of the bills provides for election of 120 delegates—one from each assembly and senatorial district—and requires ratification of the convention's work by a majority vote of the people.
