AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 310, AND DECLARING THE CLOSING UP, VACATING AND ABANDONING IN WHOLE OF THAT PORTION OF THE 15-FOOT ALLEY IN BLOCK 2 OF SUB-DIVISION OF LOT 33 OF MEADOW PARK TRACT.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby declare, determine and ordain as follows: Section 1. That proper notices have been posted and published as required by law giving notice of certain public works to be done under Resolution No. 1225 of the City of Torrance and that more than ten days have elapsed since the expiration of the time of the publication of said notice and no written objections have been filed thereto.
