OBITUARY

WILLIAM MENG . . . World War veteran who saw many months' service with the A.E.F. in the Verdun sector, died suddenly July 4 as result of a heart attack at his home, 222 1/2 255th street, Lomita. He was 45 years of age and had lived in the Lomita district for the past 15 years. Mr. Meng was an electrician employed by the Service Electric company of this city.

A native of Red Oak, Iowa, he enlisted May 3, 1917 at Grand Island, Neb. He was honorably discharged in 1919 and was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. In addition to his wife, Irene, Mr. Meng was survived by three daughters, Geraldine, Bernice, and Jacquelyn; a son, William, Jr.; his mother, Mrs. John Meng who is en route from Red Oak, Iowa, to attend the funeral; two brothers and a sister.

Funeral service will be held tomorrow (Friday) afternoon at 2 o'clock in the chapel of the National Military Home at Sawtelle and interment will be in the military cemetery there, according to A. M. Gamby, Lomita mortician, who is in charge of arrangements.
