## School Board Condemned for Tax Increase

LOS ANGELES — Condemnation of the action of the Los Angeles board of education in voting a 16-cent tax raise for 1939-10, with veiled hints of possible retaliation, was voiced this week in a formal resolution of the board of directors of the Property Owners' Association of California.

In the resolution forwarded to the school board over the signature of H. H. Jarrett, chairman of the association caustically criticized the majority vote of the board.

"The legislature of the state of California, the board of supervisors of Los Angeles county, the city council of Los Angeles and many other political subdivisions have recognized the taxpayers' serious financial plight and have reduced tax rates, read the resolution.

**Favored Teachers**  
 "But the board of education has ignored the property owners' pleas just to grant the teachers salary increase amounting to more than \$3,650,000 a year," stated Jarrett. "Our association and thousands of others pleaded with the member that school costs were already exorbitant. They ignored these pleas."

In the resolution the association declared the school board had complied with the demand of organized teacher groups for the salary raises although "teacher were already our highest paid class of public employees."

While condemning the majority members of the school board the Property Owners' Association specifically commended Dr. E. Vincent Aske who alone voted against granting the budget in increase to raise teachers' salaries.
