**L. A. Auto Show Opens Saturday**

The world premier of the 1940 American automobile, promising to be as dazzling as any Hollywood opening, will take place Saturday afternoon with the beginning of the annual Los Angeles Automobile Show at the Pan-Pacific Auditorium on Beverly boulevard.

The automobile premier for Los Angeles was set a full month ahead of its usual date, coming even before the New York show. Car buyers of Southern California thus will get the first glimpse of all the automobiles for 1940 under one roof.

Glittering new motor cars, breath-taking in their beauty and design, will be ready for the inspection of awe-struck throngs of the American automotive public. Every make of the 20 American automobiles and all body styles will be represented. The auditorium itself will be a veritable jewel-box for the encasement of the 150 "precious stones." Thirty-eight thousand yards of flame-proof silver and blended rose-colored satin will cloak every inch of the lofty ceiling and walls of the hall.

An added attraction to the expansive display of the automobiles will be a large-scale demonstration of television in a specially constructed room in the auditorium. Television station W68X0, a 1000 watt station, will broadcast regular programs from downtown Los Angeles specially for the demonstration. The home-type receiver being used will take a foot square image on its screen.

To blend with the motif of gaiety and youthfulness of the 1940 exhibit, Jean Tighe and her 20 glamorous girls will provide musical entertainment for visitors. A special attraction of this band of beautiful girls will be the Singing Strings.
