Changes from low, through second and third, and into fourth, or cruising gear, are entirely automatic. Gears, incidentally, are always in mesh—so that there can be no clashing of gears or chipping of gear teeth. This means also that the engine serves as a brake on down grades.

To stop the car the driver simply steps on the brake. With no clutch to press and no gears to shift, there's nothing for the driver to do but steer, "step on it," and stop. The feature is available at an extra cost in all three series of cars.

Gas Company Now Adjusting Heaters Free

Have your house heating appliances inspected and adjusted before cold weather sets in.

This is the advice given by Dr. J. L. Pomeroy, Los Angeles county health officer, who points out that considerable illness and a number of fatalities result each Fall from the use of heating appliances which have not been put back into service without an inspection by someone competent to adjust them.

Asked if the gas company had facilities to make such inspection, G. W. Carbee, local manager for the Southern California Gas company, stated, "The gas company maintains a corps of service men who are trained especially for this work. They are ready on request to inspect and adjust all gas appliances free of charge. We suggest that our patrons call us before cold weather comes and allow us to inspect their heating equipment during the ensuing weeks."




